V.P. Franklin, Ph.D., Distinguished Professor Emeritus of History and Education at the University of California, Riverside, has served as the Editor of *The Journal of African American History*, formerly *The Journal of Negro History*, since 2002. He is the author of five books, including *The Education of Black Philadelphia* (1979); and *Black Self-Determination: A Cultural History of African American Resistance* (1984, 1992); co-editor of five books, including *Cultural Capital and Black Education* (2004); and *Message in the Music: Hip Hop, History, and Pedagogy* (2010); and has published over seventy scholarly articles on African American history and education. He is currently working a project documenting the contributions of children and teenagers to the Civil Rights movement.
